



**The Landings of Carrier Parkway** is owned and managed by The David Nicklas Organ Donor Awareness Foundation, Inc. a non-profit 501 ( c ) ( 3 ) corporation.

The Nicklas Foundation was created in 1995 by Rodney and Isibelle DeBaun after Rodney received a life saving heart transplant at the age of 36. Over the last 14 years The Nicklas Foundation has handed out over 100,000 organ donor cards and brought awareness of the need for organ donation to over 1.5 million people through personal appearances. We have reached several million more through numerous local and nationwide TV broadcasts including PAX TV's series "It's a Miracle". In addition our story has been featured in numerous newspapers and magazine articles published both locally and nationwide, including the September 8, 1997 issue of Newsweek magazine and the article featured below by Steve Blow of The Dallas Morning News.

On October 20, 1993 David Matthew Nicklas' life came to a tragic end. On October 22, 1993 through David's gift Rodney's new life began.

One of David's mother's greatest worries was that people would forget who her son was. Through this **Foundation** that bears his name and by you choosing The Landings as your home we are insuring that **David Matthew Nicklas** and the loving and generous young man that he was, **will not be forgotten.**

There are currently over **104,504** people waiting for a life saving organ transplant. Each person on that list is someone's mother, father, daughter, or son. You can make the choice to help others by becoming an organ donor upon your death. If you do make the decision to become an organ donor, share that decision with your family and friends. Let them know that this is your wish. Every 20 minutes a new name is added to the national transplant list. As we found out in 1993, it could be you or someone you love that becomes a number on that list. If you are willing to receive you must be willing to give.
